Long ride to help sick kids

IT'S BEEN a long road for these cyclists but an even greater one for kids with cancer. Though every ounce of sweat and every kilometre in their 970km journey has brought them closer to helping sick kids.

Former footy great **Andrew Jarman** and daughter **Charlie**, below, were among a pack of cyclists to ride from Adelaide to Melbourne to raise more than \$100,000 for CanTeen.

The retired Crows champion-turned-media personality says he's done plenty of pre-seasons where "they mentally try to break you". "But this is the most challenging thing I've ever done – I can't feel my legs," he says. Despite the pain, Andrew says thinking of the sick kids that CanTeen supports pushed him to the finish line.



"There's no question, they drove us when we were feeling really bad," he says.

The 13 cyclists, including former Sydney Swan and now Crows assistant coach **Ryan O'Keefe** and News Corp editorial director for SA, WA, NT and Tasmania, **Melvin Mansell**, will finish their six-day journey at Melbourne's Federation Square this afternoon. A film return to die for

POPULAR movie franchise *Die Hard* is set to return to the big screen for a sixth film.

Live Free Or Die Hard director **Len Wiseman** is understood to be teaming up with producer **Lorenzo di Bonaventura** for the project, while **Bruce Willis** is expected to reprise the iconic role of NYPD cop John McClane.

Another yet-to-be-named actor will play a younger version of Bruce's character, with the sixth instalment in the series set to be a prequel to the original 1988 action blockbuster, which was based on the 1979 novel *Nothing Lasts Forever*.

The *Die Hard* franchise has so far grossed a staggering \$1.4 billion.
